### GREENING NEPAL'S URBANIZATION: LINKING PLANNING TO FINANCING

#### Green Municipal Development Program

### Overview of the Green Municipal Development Program (GMDP)

The Global Green Growth Institute (GGGI) is an international organization committed to promoting growth that simultaneously achieves poverty reduction, social inclusion, environmental sustainability, and economic development. GGGI has 28 member countries and operations in 25 countries. In Nepal, GGGI is embedded within the Ministry of Forests and Environment (MOFE), in Singha Durbar, where it works in partnership with the Government of Nepal delivering thematic expertise for green growth policy and projects.

At the request of the Government of Nepal, the Institute is working in partnership with the Ministry of Forests and Environment (MOFE) and the Ministry of Federal Affairs and General Administration (MOFAGA), and in collaboration with the Ministry of Urban Development (MOUD), to develop and implement the *Green Municipal Development Program*. This program supports leadership in municipalities to identify green growth opportunities and implement comprehensive strategies, plans and projects for green urban development.

### Presenting Assessment Findings and Moving Forward with Projects

The GMDP began in 2017, with a Municipal Green Growth Assessment undertaken in each of the seven participating municipalities listed below. Based on this assessment, a range of green growth opportunities and actions have been identified, spanning policy, planning, programing and project implementation. Following rounds of review at the Federal and local level, the Municipal Green Growth Assessments have been finalized. To present the findings of the assessments and provide a platform for knowledge sharing and best practices, a workshop will be held in the last week of June, in Kathmandu. These assessments constitute the core outputs of Phase 1 of the Green Municipal Development Program (Scoping Phase). With their completion, Federal and local governments, with the support of the Institute and its partners, will transition into Phase 2 of the program.

The Government of Nepal recently reclassified Village Development Communities to municipalities based on a set of preset criteria. With this reclassification exercise, more than 250 municipalities have been added and approximately 60% of Nepal is now classified as urban. The Municipal Green Growth Assessments indicate that many newly reclassified municipalities are tasked with a range of activities which pose technical, financial and administrative challenges, including the preparation of baseline profiles, establishing municipal visions and plans, undertaking surveys, setting bylaws, serve as a platform to facilitate experience and knowledge sharing between municipalities. The workshop will also priorities, policies and finance. In addition to local solutions, international solutions and best practices will also be shared in four sectors that have been identified as priority sectors for the municipalities through the assessment reports. The municipal financing.

These discussions will also help program participants to set priorities for Phase II of the Green Municipal Development Program. As such, in addition to leaders of participating municipalities, the MOFE, MOFAGA, MOUD and other key national stakeholders, including development partners will attend the event. Specific objectives of the workshop include:





- To present consolidated findings from the Municipal Green Growth Assessment Reports To help municipalities in planning and identifying priorities through project initiatives
- To link plans to implementation, including through the identification of resources and leveraging financing
- To present and share experiences by national and international experts in the priority sectors on green best
- To discuss priorities and opportunities for Phase II of the Green Municipal Development Program
